

Oregon Values & Beliefs – Survey 1 (of 3) Annotated Questionnaire

Topics: General feelings about Oregon; optimism about personal future; public service priorities; general issues as competing policy statements: public safety, economic growth vs. environmental protection, transportation investment, growth management, amount of government services, economy and consumption, climate change, government spending/deficit; organization image; demographics

Research Design:

- Scientific random sample survey of 2,971 Oregonians in 5 regions of the state
- Conducted May/June 2013
- Data collected by telephone (landline and cell) and online to reach more Oregonians
- Regional quotas based on U.S. Census Updates for age, gender, and income to ensure representative samples within regions
- Regions proportionally weighted for statewide results per U.S. Census Updates
- 20 minute survey instrument with 70 closed and open-ended questions
- Quality control measures including pre-testing, questionnaire triangulation, validations, and monitoring calls completed for telephone surveys
- Overall margin of error +/- 1.8% at 95% confidence level


